PROGRAM

BEN THRELKELD introduced our speaker.



Professor Eric Jensen whose talk was titled "Seven Myths about Afghanistan". Eric Jensen holds ioint appointments at the Stanford Law School and Stanford's Center Democracy, Development and the Rule of Law. He is also the faculty director of

the Afghanistan Legal Education Project which designed and built a law degree-granting program at the American University of Afghanistan (AUAF). Professor Jensen is not only an expert on Afghanistan

but is the son of a staunch lifelong Rotarian as well as being a close neighbor of Mike McMahon.

Myth #1: Either the Republicans or Democrats are to blame for the "failure" of the war. There was inappropriate use of the withdrawal date.

Myth #2: Afghanistan is "America's Longest War". Since 2015 only 79 US soldiers killed

Myth #3; International terrorist groups have migrated out of Afghanistan to other regions of the world. Expect expansion in Afghanistan.

Myth #4: Taliban have a unified, vertically integrated command structure separate from ISIS, ISIS-K and other terrorist groups. These groups share people, resources and techniques.

Myth #5: State-building in Afghanistan was a failure and state-building project will fail. US could have succeeded with much more modest expectations and funding levels.

Myth #6: Getting out of Afghanistan will cost less in blood and treasure than staying would have. Beware the "boomerang effect".

Myth #7: The Taliban will act in their interests, not their ideology. Hopeful sign, though, is that in 2006 AUAF opened with 51 students, only one being female. Last spring there were

1000 students using virtual classes and about half were female.

RALPH ADAMS asked about success in working with villages. HENRIETTA BURROUGHS asked about humanitarian aid and we learned that everything goes through the UN.
