

The artists, Abi Mustapha, Debra Koppman, Jessica Eastburn, and Olivia Losee-Unger, drew their inspiration from the unique character and rich history

of the California Avenue district. The murals almost a mile of art – will remain on display through summer.... If you cross the Highway 101 Pedestrian/ Bicycle Bridge, you'll see grass-themed aluminum railings and three

sculptures that double as creative seating by artist Mary Lucking.... At the new Palo Alto Junior Museum &
