introduced John Hutar, who was a



career veteran in the Hotel industry, including managing the St. Francis and overseeing MGM Grand in Los Vegas. He was General Manager at Dinah's in Palo Alto before joining the San Mateo County/Silicon Valley Convention and Visitors Bureau, which just recently rebranded themselves as The San Francisco Peninsula.

The area lost a lot of tourism during covid, falling behind states that are less densely populated and that had less restrictive covid protocols, such as Florida and Texas. 2021 tourism was about 1/3 of what a typical year would have been before covid. We are rebounding with the help of funds allocated by the legislature last year, and in March of 2022 hotel occupancy was 63%.

Founded in 1971, the bureau serves as the film commission for the area and has a farm to

table program. They partner with 140 hotels, 15,700 rooms and 295 non-hotel tourism partners (such as Gamble Garden).

Website traffic has increased dramatically with people at home more and wanting to know what restrictions apply before booking travel. His bureau is expanding digital marketing and social media outreach.

In 2022 they are looking to engage more with countries that are in sync with our covid protocols – the UK, France, Germany, Canada and Mexico - while the high-spending Asian tourism will be slower to rebound because of their covid situations. They will also continue to promote domestic tourism, which has saved the day. Peninsula Restaurant Week is May 13-21 – support your local restaurants!
