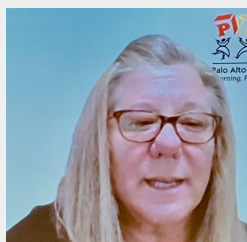

Past President BEN THRELKELD announced that **President CASH** will be debunked and **President-elect KAREN ROHDE** will be enthroned at a



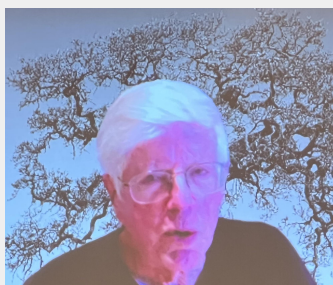

changes that had occurred in his 40-year career in dentistry in Palo Alto. He also alluded to the fact that he had joined Rotary originally for male company.

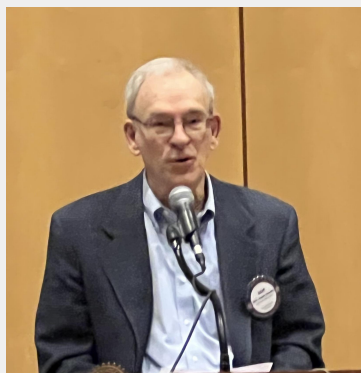
The next speaker was **CHESLEY DOUGLAS** who had first joined Rotary in San Jose in 1979 because his father had been a long-time
