THAILAND VISIT

Past-President **CASH ALAEE** gave a report with photo illustrations on his recent visit to two Rotary Clubs in Thailand (Sanni Phangan and Bangkok) where he was warmly received. While there, he participated, movingly, in a Food for Life distribution project. CASH shared photos of Rotary banner exchanges at these two clubs in Thailand, and presented their banners to KAREN.









BUILDING CLUB FELLOWSHIP

To encourage greater friendship within the club and to prepare for our speaker's topic, President KAREN asked everyone to break into small groups for five minutes and share answers to two questions. What is their favorite public land and what memory or inspiration do they associate with it?

PROGRAM

BETSY BECHTEL introduced our speaker **John Leshy**, a leading expert in public lands policy. Leshy is a graduate of the Harvard Law School and now a Professor Emeritus at the UC San Francisco College of the Law. He has recently published a history of America's public lands titled "Our Common Ground" and has an impressive background in high level government legal



positions, many of them involving studying the US Interior Department.

In his talk, Leshy traced the history of America's public lands. He started by pointing out that the US now owns almost one third of the nation's land – more than 600 million acres of public forests, plains, mountains, wetlands, deserts and shorelines. He then went on to explain how this all came about and how it has not been a divisive force in American politics, that there have not been partisan divisions involved and that there has not been a national government land grab carried out over local and state opposition. He also debunked the view that decisions to conserve lands have been made by the executive branch over the opposition of many in Congress. He concluded by stating that the history of public lands represents some of the best thinking and acting in the interests of future generations.

In the question time, HAL MICKELSON asked about the extent of influence of US public land policies on other countries; Jane Martin asked about the restrictions and protections involved; BETSY BECHTEL asked about mining and forestry factors.
