NEW MEMBER INDUCTION



TODAYS PROGRAM



GINNY LEAR

introduced our speaker, **Bernadine Chuck Fong**. Having served as President for 12 years nearly 15 years ago, Foothill College was so fortunate to have her agree to return as the interim President. A Palo Alto native and

three degree graduate of Stanford University, as was her father before her, education has been the focus of Bernadine's whole career. Right now, she also directs several leadership initiatives for the Stanford U. Office of the Vice Provost for Graduate Education. She is a former member of the Stanford University Board of Trustees.

She noted that Foothill College, founded in 1957, is celebrating its 65th anniversary. She highlighted Foothill's involvement in community partnerships with Stanford. Foothill's tuition is \$1,500 per year. While current enrollment is down to 10,600, due to the pandemic, enrollment is increasing demographic diversity and experiential learning. Also, since the 2017-18 year, Bachelor Degrees have been available, moving beyond Associate Degrees. Dental Hygiene has been added as a major. Other vocations will soon be added..

Over 22,000 K-12 teachers have participated in training at the Krause Center for Innovation. Foothill has increased STEM partnerships with Stanford which focus on male and female and ethnic diversity. In addition, Middle College continues for Palo Alto and Mountain View -Los Altos High School students as well as courses at 18 high schools.

In the future, more attention will move to include virtual and augmented reality and campuses abroad in eight countries. Work with the Magical Bridge Foundation will focus on a child developmental program with adults, children and people with disabilities. Bernadine wants to engage the public and is looking for members on their advisory board.

Questions included housing and housing insecurity for students since there are no dorms, especially for international students. **RALPH ADAMS** noted that former Palo Alto Rotarian, the late Bob Smithwick was a founding Foothill College Board member. Bernadine said to check the website for services available from the Foothill pet clinic. Bernadine was commended for becoming a new Los Altos Rotarian.

PATTY MCQUIGIAN shared a personal Rotary Endowment promotion of a book sale. The children's books are Leonardo and The Time Travelers who are Patty's grandsons, going on a fictional adventure.
