It's the custom during Sukkot to set up a temporary structure called a *sukka*, sometimes translated as a "booth" or "tabernacle," reminiscent of the shelters covered with leaves in which ancient farmers lived while doing the work of the harvest.... Arielle noted that the Jewish faith has always emphasized the importance of community. For example, there are prayers that can be said only when ten people gather together. She quoted Rabbi David Fernandez as saying, "Community is fellowship based on a shared interest," such as the work of serving the needy and vulnerable.

to be held April 29, 2023, at the Computer History Museum in Mountain View.
