TODAY'S PROGRAM

STANS KLEIJNEN came forward to introduce our speaker, **Heidi Kuhn**, Founder and CEO of Roots of Peace, an humanitarian non profit organization she founded 25 years ago in 1997 is based in San Rafael, CA. She was inspired by Princess Diana in her work to remove landmines and then began Roots of Peace, turning mines into vines - replacing minefields with vineyards and orchards. This has impacted over 1 million farmers, spanning nine countries (incl. Afghanistan - their flagship country since 2003, Cambodia, Vietnam, and now, Guatemala).

Thanks to Roots of Peace, over one hundred thousand landmines and unexploded



ordnances have been removed since 2001. It is an effort that will take decades, and even lives, as mines are removed in many countries. Heidi brought three types of inert landmines to show us, saying, when a mine is removed a vine trellis is planted to grow grapes

With a long family history of Rotarians. One grandfather was President of San Francisco Rotary in 1940-41. As a high school Junior, Heidi was a Rotary exchange student to Japan. She has stood out with Roots of Peace, and as a Rotarian in Marin County, received the prestigious Rotary International "Service Above Self" Award in December 2021.

Heidi's numerous awards include inclusion in the 2021 Forbes 50 Over 50 List in the category of "Women Who Are Leading the Way in Impact," ; the 2002 Alumni of the Year Award for Excellence in Achievement from UC Berkeley; the 2006 Skoll Award for Social Entrepreneurship, and the 2019 Mahatma Gandhi Seva Medal.

Just this month she was awarded an Honorary Degree of the American University of Afghanistan and interviewed by ABC7, seen here: <u>Heidi Kuhn on ABC7 - November 16, 2022</u>

Heidi is a graduate of UC Berkeley, and a former CNN reporter and producer. She lives in San Rafael, with her husband, Gary. They have four children and seven grandchildren.
