TODAY'S PROGRAM



JIM SUTHERLAND introduced our speaker Dr. Michael Snyder who Chairs the Department of Genetics at Stanford University's School of Medicine--"Transforming Healthcare with Big Data and Wearables."

Essentially, wearable

health monitoring devices can help provide so much more information, and so much sooner than current, readily-available medical and testing and diagnosis.

Technology has advanced to such a degree that we can get very useful and detailed personal health information from our own smart watch and he recommends smart watches in the \$50 to \$100 range. We can monitor our own health from minute to minute. It's just amazing.

Dr. Snyder used himself as an example during his presentation and shared some of his own findings.

When asked how he finds volunteers, he said he has to turn people away.

When asked about working with insurance, he referred to "the broken healthcare system" and noted that insurance companies only pay

"sick people" and not when people are healthy.

When asked about diversity among volunteers, he noted they had many Asian and five African Americans. He added that gender representation is 50/50, male and female. He also said he needs local people to volunteer.
