## TODAY'S PROGRAM

**DARYL SAVAGE** introduced our speaker, Santa Clara County **District Attorney Jeff Rosen**. Rosen first assumed office in 2011 and his current term ends in January 2027.

Mr. Rosen began by telling us that Rotary, it turns out, plays a role in his decision making. When considering a choice or an action, he often asks himself "Could I explain my decision to a Rotary club?" He sees Rotarians as spanning the political spectrum and willing to listen.

He spoke to us on the subject of **detention and bail**.

The fundamental question of bail and detention is whether we are going to hold this person in jail before trial, or if they are to be released, under what conditions.



Mr. Rosen covered the history of bail; constitutional and legal regulation of bail; commercial bail (company that provides bail); and the need to balance the presumption of innocence with public safety. He took us through the timeline of processing someone and making decisions about their bail or release, and how release is managed with an officer much like a parole officer. The problem is that DA offices operate with a Bail Schedule, which is a ranking of standard recommended bail amounts, and that is a cookie cutter approach that penalizes the poor. He believes that wealth should play no role. He advocates for moving towards no-cash bail. If they are dangerous, they should not be released. He gave some examples from his recent experience of decisions about release or bail. The DA may recommend holding someone on bail, but the judge decides. In three of his examples (outliers, he admits) the judges were too ready to release, resulting in further criminal activity. Asked if judges are being too lenient in general, he believes these recent cases have been sobering and that judges are being careful.

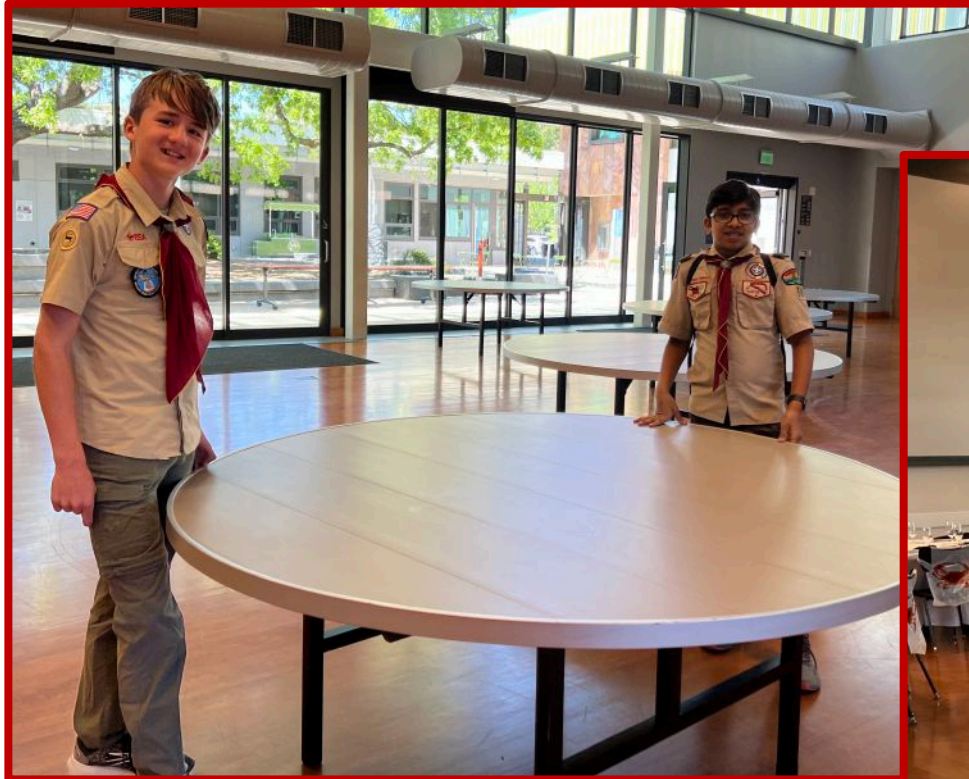

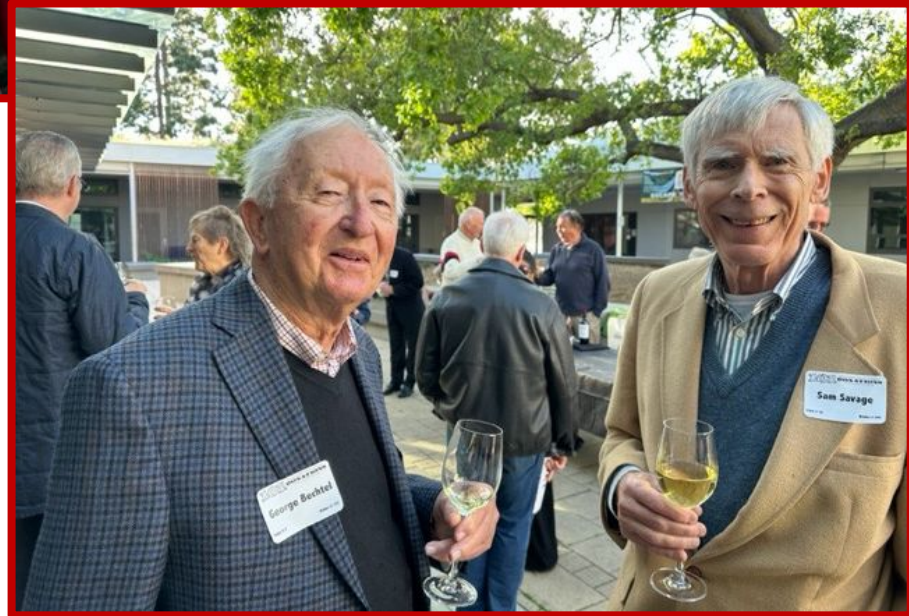
