TODAY'S PROGRAM

Our speaker, **Juliana Schroeder**, was introduced by **BEN THRELKELD**. She is Associate Professor at the Haas School of Business at the University of California, Berkeley as well as Harold Furst Chair in Management Philosophy & Values and a

Barbara and Gerson Bakar Faculty Fellow. Her M.A., M.B.A. and two Ph.D's were earned at the University of Chicago. Among her recent publications are articles about the human need for understanding and connecting and the tendency to underestimate the benefits of "prosocial input," plus a recent paper entitled 'Hello, stranger? Pleasant conversations are preceded by concerns about starting one."

According to Dr. Schroeder, our happiest

moments are not likely to be times that we've spent alone. Our brains reflect millennia of adaptation to living in small groups....
Despite the fact that we're



hyperconnected by technology, there's a loneliness epidemic, getting worse for most Americans. One-third of us experience debilitating loneliness, and it's worse for those 18 to 25.... Loneliness is as unhealthy as smoking 15 cigarettes per day.

In an experiment conducted by Dr. Schroeder that asked people to start conversations with strangers on Chicago commuter trains, participants predicted that connecting with other people would be unpleasant, but in practice most found it enjoyable. The issue was apparently an exaggerated concern about social risk - the fear of being rejected.... Social interaction is based on reciprocity, so taking the initiative usually works. Spoken conversation offers synchronicity; when you hear what another individual is saying at the moment when they say it, you are receiving humanizing cues that in a sense let you read the other person's mind.... If you think you're an introvert, you don't have to change everything in your life, but you can change small things at the margin.
