joy in her retirement.





#### **TODAY'S PROGRAM**

**BETSY BECHTEL** introduced the members giving their talks today: **ART STAUFFER, NANCY PETERS, and HAL MICKELSON.** 

**ART STAUFFER,** born in 1933, shared early parts of his life growing up in Beverly Hills in Southern California during World War 2. He attended Beverly Hills High School, became an Eagle Scout and participated in many extracurricular activities.

Art served in the US Navy in the 1950's as an engineering officer on a refueling ship in the South China Sea servicing the 7<sup>th</sup> Fleet. He

related an embarrassing shipboard story where his engineering crew cause the ship's

captain to cancel and important meeting because their error sprayed oil over the captain's clean white uniform.

Art met and married in 1960 his spouse Peggy who have celebrated 63 years of marriage.
After their marriage,



Art attended Stanford and received his MBA. Soon after he went to work with GE and then to Xerox. In between jobs, Peggy and Art took an around the world tour and accepted the Xerox job since they had run out of money. The Stauffers moved to Rochester NY and on behalf of Xerox to numerous other world-wide locations, Japan being the family's favorite. Eventually the family settled in Palo Alto where the Stauffers raised 3 children and have 6 grandchildren.

**NANCY PETERS** began by saying she is 89 years old and had this morning been given a clean bill of health from her cardiologist. She related a childhood story of the summers she spent in Vermont.



Nancy was born in New Haven Connecticut whose father was a Methodist minister. In the 1930's Nancy's father was acquainted with other faith community

members of the New Haven community who grouped together to purchase a 120 acre farm in Vermont which houses a collection of farm buildings in various states of repair. Nancy spent many summers as a child exploring the Vermont farm and watched as members of the group began to build their own summer cottages. She fondly remembers local auctions where as children would obtain fascinating items to play with. On a recent

trip back to Vermont, she purchased a set of dining chairs she is currently using.

Traveling is still very much a part of Nancy's life. She related a spur of the moment trip she and her family took to Tuscany. She has traveled to Mexico frequently. More recently Nancy and her partner have traveled extensively on the French canals on a boat they navigated on their own.

Nancy is a psychotherapist and continues to practice in Palo Alto.

**HAL MICKELSON** has been a Palo Alto Rotary Club member since 1997 and has seen a majority of Shakespeare's plays as well as Gilbert and Sullivan's operettas.

Hal related his career as an attorney, 4 years

in private practice and 33 years at Hewlett Packard and an in-house attorney. He explained the difference between in-house and private practice legal work. In-house attorneys work



faster since they are not paid by the hour.

Hal was assigned the HP's marketing division as their legal advisor. In the early days of computer technology mini computers could cost \$200,000 and customers were unfamiliar with their operation which resulted in contract issues Hal would need to resolve. One case in particular was the contract with the City of Gardena who purchased the HP 3000.

Hal was involved with antitrust compliance and avoiding price fixing concerns. Hal used his legal skills to train HP managers how to avoid legal entanglements

In the 1980's Hal moved into labor and employment law as newly enacted laws such as the Americans with Disabilities Act came into being. His work in labor and employment was especially important in HP's integrating companies they recently acquired. His work at HP also involved employee relations including hiring and firing as well as labor organizing issues.

Hal then showed all the legal areas he was not involved with such as intellectual property and patent law.

Hal was born in San Pedro, California and cleared up any confusion on how to pronounce the town's name. He attended Stanford University and Harvard Law. He was admitted to the California Bar in 1975. Hal currently serves on the Board of the Palo Alto History Museum.
