TODAY'S PROGRAM

ANNE CRIBBS introduced today's program presented by the Palo Alto Pickleball Club (PAPC), recalling a telephone call she received in 2005 requesting the sport be added to the Senior Games. At the time she did not think much of it. Now it is one of the fastest growing sports in the world and



revealed that Palo Alto Rotary and the PAPC will team up in the coming months to host a fundraiser to raise money and recruit new members! She introduced the club visitors, Monica Williams, Rich Pearson, Liling Lampell, Dave Claudino, and the main speaker, Ron Gentile.

Ron is a member and Coach at PAPC. The club is based out of the Mitchell Park racquet courts which are open to the public 6am to 10pm. Ron said the Mitchell Park courts are considered the epicenter of pickleball on the Peninsula. Their club slogan is "Arrive as a

stranger & leave as a friend". PAPC has a heavy presence at these courts and provides beginner lessons, socials, tournaments, and clinics. The programs provide socio-economic connectedness, social connection, and the exercise infuses happiness for all ages, from youth to seniors. Why is it successful? Ron reports the game often involves double play

(two players per team) and the court is smaller leading to a high rate of adoption. Liling and Rich showed us pickleball on a modified temporary court adjacent President LIZ's lectern.



(President LIZ was strictly a spectator this time). Rich said new paddle technology, by Owl, is reducing the noise that can be a complaint of neighbors. He also showed us how the game begins at the back lines of the court and progresses to the net, making the "sneaky shot" much more effective than the hard and fast shot.

PAPC is providing a clinic for Palo Alto Rotary Wednesday, April 10th, from 5:30-7pm at the Mitchell Park sport courts near the library. Just show up – they will provide the paddles and balls and beginners are welcomed. Thanks to **LINETTE KWOK** for sponsoring this presentation.
