ROTARY ENDOWMENT FUND DRIVE



TIM WATSON asked for support for our club's Endowment Fund. Established in 1982, the Endowment is a long-term investment which ensures that our work and service can have continuing support. Its value has reached \$1.22 million.

Each year 5% of principal is distributed to locally chosen charities. Tim reported that our goal this year is to add \$25,000 in donations to the Endowment, with broad participation from our membership. You can help in any of five ways: By writing a check; by an online transfer; through a donor-advised fund; by distributions from your IRA or 401(k), particularly if a distribution is mandatory; and via "planned giving" in your estate or designating the Endowment as a life insurance beneficiary. Checks and online transfers should clearly specify that they are for the Endowment.

TODAY'S PROGRAM

Our speaker, **Amy Castro**, was introduced by DANA TOM. She is an Associate Professor at the University of Pennsylvania School of Social Policy and Practice.

Professor Castro is co-founder and Executive Director of the Center for Guaranteed Income Research, and has been a co-principal investigator of 30 applied cash transfer studies.



In theory, guaranteed income programs can

take the form of "universal basic income" within a specific geography, "basic income" that is targeted but not universal, and "guaranteed income" for a fixed period of time, typically 12 to 24 months. The programs that have been evaluated by Professor Castro are not designed to replace the social safety net. One issue that has been explored is whether \$500 per month in extra income can contribute to many kinds of well-being – perhaps by making it possible to enroll in vocational education, or by opening a door to full-time employment because multiple part-time jobs are no longer necessary. The effects can include allowing parents to spend more time with their children and reducing the rate of absences from school.
