TODAY'S PROGRAM

• International Day of the World's Indigenous People was last Friday, August 9.

DANA TOM introduced our two speakers **Melissa Nelson** and **Corrina Gould** whom he heard on KQED Forum when they spoke about the City of Berkeley returning sacred land, the oldest Ohlone shellmound, to an Indigenous trust.

- Berkeley's mayor called it the largest urban land give-back in California history.
- It took nearly a decade of litigation, so it's been a long journey.

• The city acquired the land for 27 million dollars, mostly with money from the Sogorea Te' Land Trust.

• Professor Melissa Nelson is an ecologist, writer, editor, media-maker and indigenous scholar-activist. At Arizona State University, she is a professor of Indigenous Sustainability in the School of Sustainability, College of Global Futures. Prior to this, she served as a

Professor of American Indian Studies at San Francisco State University. She actively advocates for



Indigenous Peoples' rights and sustainable lifeways in higher education, nonprofits, and philanthropy and is particularly passionate about Indigenous food sovereignty at local, regional and global levels. Melissa serves on the board of directors of the Sogorea Te' Land Trust.

Corrina Gould is the tribal spokesperson for the Confederated Villages of Lisjan. She was born and raised in her ancestral homeland, the territory of Huchiun. Corrina has worked on preserving and protecting the sacred burial



sites of her ancestors throughout the Bay Area for decades. She is the Co-Director for the Sogorea Te' Land Trust, a women-led

organization within the urban setting of her ancestral territory of the Bay Area that works to return Indigenous land to Indigenous people

Corrina spoke of the plans for the shellmound in Berkeley. The land is near the bay and will



be a mound covered with flowers, poppies and lupine. Eventually 56 native Indigenous Peoples remains will be moved from the University to the shellmound. The land will be a place for people to pray and work to bring back language and song. In 1909, 425 shellmounds were mapped and found around the bay. Almost all are gone, now buried under buildings, railroad tracks, and highways.

Melissa spoke about the dozens of projects like this one in the land back movement. It is urban based and women led and an intertribal model. 70% of native americans live in urban areas.
