thoughtful individuals, experienced and articulate speakers, resulted in few startling differences between their positions. (*The reporter's observation.*) Low has a background in California State Government while Liccardo has been a public prosecutor, and former Mayor of San Jose. The candidates both made several individual references to these differing aspects of their careers. Low challenged Liccardo on policing and his outside financial backing from former New York City Mayor Michael Bloomberg. Liccardo touted his record of success in governing San Jose. Both acknowledged the long-time accomplishments of Anna Eshoo. In summing up Low made the point that character matters and Liccardo stood by his achievements in getting things done. President **REBECCA** thanked them both, with a parting gift of a mug with a special motto.
