JIM SUTHERLAND introduced our speakers today. Longtime members all:

BILL JOHNSON: A member of our club for 27 years. He began by sharing his commitment to Rotary was greater than his previous year's



meeting attendance due to the demands of operating a local newspaper. A strong advocate for Rotary BILL

is past chair of Grants Committee and looks forward to new opportunities with our club. He fondly recalled his childhood in Portola Valley and involvement with 4-H raising sheep, woodworking and electrical projects. A lifelong friend of the McCLoskey family, BILL campaigned, interned and became press secretary for Congressman Pete McCloskev. Returning from Washington DC and pursuing new opportunities BILL found investors and started the Palo Alto Weekly refining the journalistic priorities toward a progressive, community-minded organization. He recounted the late Daniel Pearl as a former journalist in Palo Alto and remains committed to the importance of saving local journalism. Along with professional and journalistic pursuits BILL enjoys time with grandkids and a new puppy.

CASH ALAEE: His journey to Palo Alto began in 1978 Iran bringing him to California in 1983 and eventually to Palo Alto. Having studied

He remains connected to the clubs in Thailand and is motivated to continue contributing to improving conditions for others.
