retired in 2017 as
sports columnist at
the San Jose Mercury
News. After 33 years
on the job, he has
much to share



He joined the San Jose Merc in 1984, covered 14 Olympic games and 32 Super Bowls, and

was named one of America's top ten sports journalists by the Associated Press and the Wall Street Journal. He is responsible for the name, McCovey Cove! In 2021, he became the first journalist inducted into the San Jose Sports Hall of Fame. Perhaps more important to members of our club, Mark wrote the copy about ANNE for her Bay Area Hall of Fame plague.

Mark shared with us many tales from his recent book entitled "The San Francisco 49ers, and Illustrated Timeline." He took



us through the history of the 49ers, with lots of stories, to the delight of the many fans in the room. News to many, the 49ers originated at Santa Clara University. Two Santa Clara students, Al Ruffo and Tony Morabito, loved football. Years after graduating, seeing Kezar stadium sitting unused, they got serious about their college fantasy of starting a football team. They successfully founded the 49ers with the team colors of red and gold, which are the colors of Santa Clara, and many early players were Santa Clara grads. Their first games were at Kezar.

The 49ers were the first NFL team to be owned by women – the wives of Tony Morabito and his brother. One of the 49ers Super Bowl appearances was at Stanford Stadium in 1984. Steve Jobs paid for Apple-logoed seat cushions for the splintery wooden seats.

Mark filled the half hour, leaving questions for after the meeting, when he was surrounded by a crowd.
