SALLY TOMLINSON introduced our speaker, **Stuart B**, **Weiss**, **PhD** with Creekside Science, who provided an insight into the migration patterns of Monarch butterflies and their California overwintering

habitats. In one overwintering season multiple generations are produced and the butterflies are attracted to non-native eucalyptus trees. Originally Monterey Pines were the tree of

choice. Using hemispherical photography to measure canopy for populations the habitats can be sustained or modified to provide the appropriate micro-climate. Like most Rotarians the Monarch Butterflies are not fond of excess heat, cold or wind. To learn
