PROGRAM

DANA TOM introduced our speaker today, **Dannagal Young,** professor of

Communication and Political Science at the
University of Delaware. Her research interests
include political media effects, media
psychology, public opinion
and the psychology of misinformation.



Professor Young's book *Irony and Outrage:*The Polarized Landscape of Rage, Fear, and

Laughter in the U.S. examines satire and outrage as the logical extensions of the respective psychological profiles of liberals and conservatives.

Her most recent book is Wrong: How Media, Politics, and Identity Drive our Appetite for Misinformation.

On NPR's Hidden Brain podcast, Professor Dannagal Young spoke about how our different responses to ambiguity shape our behavior, perspectives, and political beliefs. She asked, do we have a higher tolerance for ambiguity or higher in a need for closure?

Our traits predict our beliefs. We need both kinds of thinkers. It even affects our appreciation for abstract art! Her research explores how the psychology of liberals and conservatives shapes how they process information and their preferences for media genres and political aesthetics.

Dr. Young's 2020 TED Talk explaining how our psychology shapes our politics, and how media exploit these relationships, has been viewed over 2 Million times. She studies the intersection of entertainment and information, including the psychology of political satire. She publishes extensively in the popular press with essays and Op-eds in outlets including Vox.com, The Washington Post, and The Atlantic. She also has appeared on CNN, PBS Newshour, ABC News and many other locations..
