LIZ KNISS introduced our speaker, the Honorable Anna Eshoo, Member of Congress, CA-18, 1993-2025. Prior to her election to the US Congress, Congresswoman Eshoo served on the San Mateo

served on the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors for ten years. When Liz asked Anna

what she was most proud of, her reply was that, second only to her kids, she is most

proud of representing such a prestigious district.

Anna recognized that this is Women's History Month. Women were left out of the

Constitution. When she ran in 1992 there were 34 women out of 435. The results of that election increased the number to 54 women, dubbing that "the year of the woman." But there was backsliding, and in the next election, most of those women lost



their seats. Nearly 400 women have served in Congress. As of January 23 this year, there were 153 women serving in Congress.

The single most memorable moment for her is the attack on the Capitol. "They came to kill." It ended when Speaker Pelosi said they were going back into chambers, because the people of the US and the people of the world need to see our democracy functioning.

Nancy Pelosi's election as speaker in 2007 was a milestone, and Pelosi worked hard to recruit more women for elected service. Other memories that stand out for Anna: visiting our troops in Iraq and Afghanistan; the visit of the Pope to a joint session of Congress; being sworn in every two years, which reminded her of the careful planning by the framers of our Constitution.

"The power in this country is embedded in the people." She is heartened by what people are doing, protesting, writing and calling their representatives. She was reminded of a Russian diplomat who said to her, "you have something we don't have. You have citizens, you have philanthropists, you have volunteers." She believes that we need to

recognize the strengths we have and keep committed to them. We need to fortify ourselves in those things that bring strength to a community – when communities are strong, we all are stronger. She called on the memory of the men buried at Normandy, who knew what they were risking when they went into war. If they could give what they did, then we can rise to the occasion as well. She has no doubt that we will.

SHERRI SAGER: How do we get more members of Congress to live up to their principles? Anna responded – it is important to understand what the framers designed and intended. It is not only sad that the Congress is not engaged, it is dangerous. Our system depends on both political parties functioning. Citizens are letting their elected officials know when they think the representative is not standing up for their principles.

There is hope, but the American people are the ones that are going to change it.

HENRIETTA BURROUGHS joined the President's club to thank Anna for all the support she gave Henrietta and all of us. Question: When do you think we will see some changes? Anna responded that the midterm is the next chance. Right now, Congress isn't handling it.

"Keep the faith in our beautiful country. We're going to come through it."
