DANA TOM introduced today's speaker;

Janine Zacharia

who is currently a lecturer at Stanford University's Department of Communication and has been the Jerusalem Bureau Chief for the Washington Post, chief diplomatic correspondent for Bloomberg News, Washington bureau chief for the Jerusalem Post. and Jerusalem correspondent for Reuters. She has



reported on Israel, the Middle East and U.S. foreign policy for close to two decades. She is the recipient of the 2020-21 Dean's Award for Distinguished Teaching in the Stanford University School of Humanities and Sciences. She is the author of several books including "How to Report Responsibly on Hacks and Disinformation", and "Polarization and the Press: 12 Ways to Restore Respect for Your Reporting".

Today Janine held a lively interactive discussion on the current challenges in journalism, including misinformation, disinformation, the decline of local news, and the erosion of public trust in legacy media and why that might be occurring. Janine emphasized the importance of supporting public media and critical thinking. She asked thoughtful questions like "what is news" and "who is a journalist"; giving members a chance to process those questions as a group. She shared a snippet of her experience in the field and the vital role of journalist and editor as agents of a process.
