PROGRAM

GINNY LEAR introduced **Margaret Abe-Koga**, member of the Santa Clara

County Board of Supervisors. Margaret represents our District, the 5th, made up of nine of the 15 cities in Santa Clara County and stretching from Palo Alto to Los Gatos. She is the fifth woman to represent the District. Our member Liz Kniss was one of the previous four.



Margaret is one of the first Asian American women to serve on the Santa Clara County board in its 175 years of existence.

Margaret brings 20 years of experience in governing to the county as a two-time Mayor of Mountain View and council member and a former Trustee of the Santa Clara County Board of Education.

In recognition of Asian American Pacific Islander month Margaret was asked to describe some of her experiences. She spoke of the work of Asian immigrants in California and the discrimination endured. Her parents were born in Japan and came to California for opportunity after World War II. Once Margaret, born in California, learned English she became her parents' translator. This is a role often played by children of immigrants.

Margaret spoke about the importance of the services provided by the County. Many of the services provide a safety net for low income residents. The County operates 4 hospitals, half of the County's \$13 billion budget. Any cuts to Medicaid will deeply affect the County. In addition to providing health services the County operates parks,

expressways, has built 5800 units of teacher and other housing, and many, many other services

High priorities for Margaret are to wisely balance the County's budget and ensure that there are no duplications of services. Another top priority is addressing climate issues.
