DANA TOM introduced **Roland Greene**, Stanford Professor of English and Comparative Literature, speaking on "Shakespeare: Young, Old and in the Middle"

Did you ever wonder how Shakespeare speaks to us at every stage? Stanford Professor Roland Greene took us on a lively tour through "Shakespeare--Young, Old and Out in the Middle." Whether you are building Romeo, a worldly Lear, or somewhere in between, this

talk brought wisdom, and a fresh look at the Bard.

William Shakespeare's eras are defined by his writing style. Scholars of music and literature often speak of "Ite style," but William Shakespeare had distinctive styles in each stage of his career (he retired around the age of 50 and died at 52, elderly for his time.)

Professor Roland Greene led us in exploring the perspectives of his middle and old age as compared to how we now conceive these stages of life.

His research and teaching are concerned with the early modern literature of England, Latin Europe, and the translation world, and with poetry and "poetics" from the Renaissance to the present.

Professor Greene's most recent book is Five Words: Critical Semantics in the Age of Shakespeare and Cervantes, which proposes an understanding of early culture through modern...the changes embodied in five words or concepts over the sixteenth century: in English, blood, invention, language, resistance, and world--and their counterparts in French, Italian, Spanish and Portuguese.
