PROGRAM

ULLRICH SCHWERTSCHLAG briefly introduced our speaker Dr. Jonathan Chen, Director for Medical Education in Artificial Intelligence at Stanford University. His topic was the place of AI in Medicine and he made a



very lively and provocative presentation. By way of introduction, Dr Chen briefly treated us to a brief magic performance. He compared the computer strengths of memory, calculation, search, prediction, consistency and being scalable with the human strengths

of physicality, communication, empathy, management, interpretation and reasoning. The first point he then made was that AI was remarkably good at diagnostics and that it could easily pass conventional medical examinations. The second point he emphasized was that AI's abilities in the medical field were improving at an astonishing rate. This lead to the key question of what does this mean for the role of doctors. He pointed out that although AI can generate conventional forms of empathy, it sometimes makes obvious errors and promotes false facts. The important conclusion is that

doctors have superior judgment, the



important ability to negotiate and can accept responsibility. Dr. Chen concluded with this thought, "although AI is not going to replace doctors, those that learn how to use AI are likely to replace those who do not."
