
Her parents encouraged her to attend college where she earned a Bachelor's degree and MBA in Pakistan. When she and her husband came to the United States she earned a Master's degree in economics which led to a 12 year career in the corporate world. She loved the Indian food of her childhood and cooked it for friends which then led to catering, teaching others to cook, and eventually to her highly successful restaurant, Zareen's on California Avenue in Palo Alto, which opened in 2014.

She won a Palo Alto Tall Tree Award in 2024 for Outstanding Business.

Palo Alto Online wrote, "According to the restaurant's nomination papers, the restaurant is being honored for its contributions to the community, which include delivering free food to first responders and hospital workers during Covid, making its dining room available for use by community groups and providing health care, train passes and bus passes to its employees." This year, she released a cookbook, Zareen's Pakistani Kitchen: Recipes from a Well-Fed Childhood, which furthers her mission of supporting and empowering

women. Half of the earnings from cookbook

Zareen gave 24 copies of the book to Rotary to sell for \$50 each, benefitting our Palo Alto Charities. The first 12 were quickly snapped up, with 12 more to come. Thank you, Zareen, for your generosity to us and so many others.
