## PHILOSOPHY



The object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

1. The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;
2. High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;
3. The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;
4. The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.



This objective is further set against the "Rotarian four-way test," used to see if a planned action is compatible with the Rotarian spirit. The test was developed by Rotarian and entrepreneur Herbert J. Taylor during the Great Depression as a set of guidelines for restoring faltering businesses and was adopted as the standard of ethics by Rotary in 1942. It is still seen as a standard for ethics in business management.

## GIVING BACK



Driven entirely by volunteers, donated resources and fundraising events, Rotary Club of Warrington has virtually no overhead, making it a highly efficient resource for providing needed services and support. With infrastructure already in place, it is free to devote the entirety of its energies to organizing and delivering assistance. We have generated funding for charitable work through local events. Since events are volunteer-staffed, all proceeds go directly where they can do the most good.

In recent years, the Rotary Club of Warrington has funded the following philanthropic efforts:

### Locally

- Awarded scholarships to many local high school students for their outstanding service
- Provided "I Like Me" program to local kindergarten classes
  - This program addresses illiteracy and has been done with over 1,000 students in the Warrington Area
- Sends kids to summer camp that wouldn't have had the opportunity
- Supports Adaptive Skiing program
  - Helps handicapped individuals develop confidence
- Sings Happy Birthday to Neshaminy Manor residents (Long Term Care Facility) during the month of their birthday
  - One of the longest running rotary traditions in the US
- Produced annual golf tournament
- Adopts Pickertown Rd as part of Warrington Township's "adopt a road" program
- Raised funds and assisted in construction of the Veterans Memorial at ITW Park
- Hosted the annual 4-Way Speech Contest
- Renovated the bus shelters and benches on 611 in Warrington

### Nationally

- Supported assistance to Hurricane Katrina victims

### International

- Provided funding for fresh water drinking project
- Support Roto-plast program
  - Provides free reconstructive surgery and treatment to those with cleft palate and related anomalies in developing countries
- Led and supported a Wheelchairs in Argentina program
  - This program led by a Warrington Rotarian has provided over 2,000 wheelchairs for those in need
- Developed and continues to support a guide dog program in Israel
  - Developed and led by a Warrington Rotarian and has provided seeing eye dogs to over 300 people
- Provided housing and aid during the Haitian Earthquake disaster
