Today we welcomed visiting Rotarian John Fulwider from the Blaine club. Mourad Rhai was our guest presenter. Dr. Rhai received a PhD in Chemistry from the University of Cincinnati. He established in-house testing laboratories at Boston Scientific, Inc. and was instrumental in the development of the drug-coated cardiac stent. Dr. Rhai's presentation delved into a global concern regarding coating materials in consumer products that produce ill effects in humans, starting in-utero. Health effects are suspected to include autism, ADHD, asthma and infertility. Materials include coatings for food, carpet and furniture, as well as fire retardants in furniture and appliances. April 24 - Club Meeting

Our presenters today were two representatives from "Take Action Minnesota" - board member Gene Nichols and training manager Elizabeth Lienesch. This group lobbies and acts on behalf of a number of issues defined as social justice issues. Today's presentation focused on the organizing that is currently underway for the purpose of creating and maintaining a statewide Healthcare Exchange, which is mandated by the Federal Affordable Care Act. Per the bill's requirements, any state not creating such an exchange will end up being part of a federal exchange. As most of us know from the large volume of publicity surrounding this highly controversial legislation, some of the key elements of the ACA are that everyone will be required to have health insurance, business with more than 50 employees will be required to provide health insurance, and no one can be denied coverage due to pre-existing conditions. Anyone without employer-sponsored health insurance will be able to obtain it through the Healthcare Exchange. Our Minnesota initiative falls under State Commerce Commissioner Rothman. The ACA was signed into law by President Obama in March of 2010. Most elements go into effect in 2014, but the U.S. Supreme Court is currently considering a request to overturn it as unconstitutional.
