October 4th - Club Meeting

We welcomed regular visitor Bill Nielsen from the St. Paul club today - his last visit before heading west to California for the winter. He will return when the trees turn green again! Today was our quarterly Club Assembly. Instead of an outside speaker, John Suzukida and Bob Meyer facilitated a group discussion on topics we should all be aware of related to our club's organization and finances. John talked through the new organization structure being promoted by Rotary International. This includes a new "Avenue of Service" entitled "New Generations", which will be chaired by Colleen Lavin for our club and covers many of the youth related activities such as the international youth exchange program and Interact Club. Colleen will be supported by others in this busy area. The "Vocational" avenue of service had been left open, but, after some discussion, Dennis Erno volunteered to lead this area and provide some focus in the area of business ethics. Kevin Keenan proposed and received support for a team effort around new member recruitment which will begin soon. It was noted that we are projecting expenses/contributions in excess of revenue this year. We are able to manage this because of a balance maintained in our Healthy Youth fund, but obviously this is not sustainable long term. Focus will need to be placed on increasing the proceeds from our existing fund-raising activities or identifying new fund-raising opportunities.

October 11th - Club Meeting

We welcomed special guest Irene Meinen today, as well as Rebecca Gagne (sp?), a member of Rotaract and relative of Mark Stange's wife Cynthia. Rebecca was new to town last year and looking for ways to get involved. Mark wisely suggested Rotaract and Rebecca quickly got very involved, including an upcoming trip to Nicaragua to work on sustainability issues. Today's speakers were Roger Salway and Malcolm McLean from Compatible Technology Int'l. Roger is a retired John Deere executive and Malcolm is a longtime supporter and former Chairman of the Board of the organization. (Malcolm is also a member of the St. Paul Rotary Club). CTI develops basic practical tools to help with post-harvest agricultural challenges in developing countries. Their simple machines have dramatically improved yields and processing times, which has led to much improved quality of life in these challenging places. The organization consists of 3 paid staff and 150 volunteers from all walks of life. They recently celebrated their 30th anniversary and would welcome more partnership with Rotary. They have also recently branched out to work on potable water projects, especially in Nicaragua.

October 18th - Club Meeting

Club President Robert Meyer indicated that two items had been discussed at the recent Board meeting: 1) the Club is seeking corporate sponsors for events such as the Run and Romp and Kid's Triathlon, and 2) a discussion on the creation of a Rotary fine arts scholarship was tabled. New Club member Kent Peterson announced that the Shoreview Community Foundation would be sponsoring a Friends Supper on December 1st at the Community Center. The guest speaker is Marlin Bree, a noted sailing enthusiast and speaker at Rotary.

The guest speaker for the day was Emily Galusha, outgoing Director of the Northern Clay Center. The Clay Center, located on Franklin Avenue in Minneapolis near Riverside Hospital, has a mission of advancement of the ceramic arts. They achieve this mission through Exhibitions, Educations, and Artists Services. At the 20,000 square foot Clay Center they have two gallery areas, numerous studios for artists, and classroom and workshop areas that serve as many as 13,000 people per year. The Center also has a small retail store for selling pottery. Ms. Galusha indicated that the Northern Clay Center has a budget of about \$1.7 million per year, with about

50% of the budget paid for from merchandise sales and classroom fees. The also run classes outside the building and have a Claymobile that brings items back to the Center for firing. She also discussed some of the special events that had occurred during the past two years as the Center was celebrating its 20th year.

October 25th - Club Meeting

The Club welcomed honorary member Irene Meinen to the meeting and reported that a new member orientation had been held the night before for Kent Peterson and Sandy Bahr. The guest speaker for the meeting was Sheila Smith who serves as Executive Director of the Minnesota Citizens for the Arts. Sheila indicated that Minnesota is the top rated state in the nation for people being engaged in the arts. Minnesota also has numerous small non-profit arts organizations. She indicated that studies have shown that students involved in the arts have higher SAT scores.

Sheila talked extensively about The Minnesota Citizens for the Arts involvement in passing the Legacy amendment for the State. The proposed amendment brought together environmentalists, sportsmen groups, and arts organizations (who would not normally be lobbying and supporting the same type of legislation) to support its passage. The legacy amendment provides dedicated sales tax funds that are split between land acquisition, water quality, parks and arts and culture. The amendment passed with 56% of the total vote including people who chose not to vote on the amendment, which are counted as no votes. She indicated that it has been nice to have State dedicated funding source for arts organizations. Sheila encouraged people to watch the television show Minnesota Originals produced by Twin Cities Public Television which features artists from around the State.

November 8 - Club Meeting

Today's speaker rode his bike to the meeting from his home in Shoreview - which was no big deal after the 1200k (760 mile) ride he did in France in 2010 - in about 70 hours. Bob Elias is married, with three children and works for Boston Scientific in Arden Hills. He has been passionate about biking his entire life, which led him to the sport of randonneuring, which is a long-distance cycling sport in which riders attempt to complete the course within specified time limits, and receive equal recognition regardless of their finishing order. Riders may travel in groups or alone and are expected to be self-sufficient (no sag wagon or assistance with repairs!) The route taken on this particular event was Paris to Brest on the Atlantic coast of France and back to Paris, sleeping only about 1 of those 70 hours. He proclaimed the most stressful part of the whole adventure was getting through the TSA airport inspection on both legs of his journey - trying to ensure that every single piece of his disassembled bike made it back into its carrying case. As one of 6,000 riders allowed entry into the event, Bob completed the course in well less than the 90 hours he committed to at the start. He was required to complete a number of shorter qualification rides prior to being allowed to participate. He gave many thanks to his wife for encouraging him to tackle this challenge, noting that at least she got a trip to France out of the deal!
