

All bulbs are large, very high quality Dutch bulbs purchased from Van Engelen Flower Bulb Company.



Christophii Allium (Favorite)

Circa 1884, the robust, long-lasting *Star of Persia* has immense, loosely compacted 8"- to 10"-wide globes comprised of over 50 starry, amethyst-violet florets with prominent metallic shine and green eyes (ovaries). Rabbit-, rodent- and deer-resistant, A. christophii is adored by bees, butterflies and helpful pollinators.. May/June. HZ: 4-8. 18" to 24".

Purple Sensation Allium (Favorite)

Rabbit, rodent and deer-resistant Purple Sensation has 4"- to 5"-wide, violet-purple globes comprised of dozens of starry florets. Adored by bees, butterflies and pollinators, it has become a garden essential in borders, remarkable drifts and cut flower arrangements. May/June. HZ: 4-8. 24" to 30".



Vernus Jeanne d'Arc (Returning Favorite)

Jeanne d'Arc has six-petaled, glistening white flowers with variable purple striations on the stem and flower base, orange anthers and grass-like foliage with narrow, median silver-white stripes. Its graceful 5" tall flowers open and close on sunny days. It has a reticulated tunic. Crocus Class: Dutch Large Flowering. Bulb size: 9 cm/up. Full to partial sunlight. Bloom time in horticultural zone 5: April. Plant 5" deep and 4" apart. HZ: 4-8. Height: 5".

Crocus Majestic Lavender Mix (Favorite)



For those of us who love purple, our Majestic Lavender Dutch Crocus Mixture is equal parts of spectrum-violet Flower Record, sea lavender-violet Grand Maître and gray-blue and purple striped Pickwick. Each variety has six-petaled flowers with orange anthers that open and close on sunny days, and grass-like foliage with narrow, median silver-white stripes. These larger corms have reticulated tunics. Crocus Class: Dutch Large Flowering. Bulb size: 8/9 cm. Full to partial sunlight. April. Plant 5" deep and 4" apart. HZ: 4-8. Height: 5".



Muscari Magical Mixture (Returning Favorite)

Our long-lasting balanced Magical Muscari Mixture includes Muscari armeniacum, Muscari armeniacum Siberian Tiger, Muscari latifolium and Muscari Valerie Finnis for tones of periwinkle, sapphire, cerulean, pale wisteria and white above ample foliage clumps. Full to partial sunlight. Height: 6". April/May. Plant 5" deep and 3" to 4" apart.



Chionodoxa Forbesii Blue Giant (RF)

Commonly known as *Glory of the Snow* since it is one of spring's early bloomers, Blue Giant is the improved form of C. forbesii with up to eight, larger, star-shaped, six-petaled clustered rich blue flowers with bright white central zones atop dark stems with sparse, narrow foliage. It is deer-resistant and naturalizes readily in well-draining soil and in full to partial sunlight. It's terrific planted en masse in garden borders, sunny woodland borders, rock gardens and in irregular river-like swaths.

Banja Luka Tulip (Favorite)

A sport of Apeldoorn, this jewel-toned beauty has huge flowers of marigold-yellow with bright ruby-red feathering and petal edges. Banja Luka is magnificent: it re-sparked our love of red and yellow bi-colors. Mid-April to May. HZ: 3-7. Height: 22".



Exotic Emperor Tulip (Favorite)

Also called White Valley, it opens creamy ivory-white and matures to milky-white with yellow flames and exterior petals with emerald-green striations. It is a strong, robust variety that stands up well to spring rains and wind. Double Early Tulips are known to be good for forcing. Mid-April. HZ: 3-8. Height: 20".



Candy Prince Tulip (New)

Well paired with siblings Purple Prince and Sunny Prince, Candy Prince is whisper-pink with a pale lavender glow. Single Early Tulips are known to be good for forcing. Bulb size: 12 cm/up. Mid-April. HZ: 3-8. Height: 16"



Purple Prince Tulip (Favorite)

Purple Prince's large, lilac-purple flowers have a beet root-purple interior: it is the perfect counterpoint for Single Early Tulip Princess Irene. It's also gorgeous in our Princely Tulip Mixture. Single Early Tulips are known to be good for forcing. Please see the Tulip Forcing Tips below. Tulip Class: Single Early. Bulb size: 12 cm/up. Mid-April. HZ: 3-8. 14"."



Orange Emperor Tulip (Favorite)

Blooming a bit later than some of the other Emperor Tulips, this award-winner is brilliant carrot-orange with a darker interior dotted with a pale, buttercup-yellow base and black anthers. Late April. HZ: 3-8. Height: 16" to 18".







Paul Scherer Tulip (Favorite)

Paul Scherer has stunning, purple-black, egg-shaped flowers with an interior ivory base covered by a lilac veil. Some say that this sultry charmer is even darker than the Queen of the Night . Triumph Tulips are known to be good for forcing. April/May. HZ: 3-7. Height: 18".



Pink Impression (Favorite)

The original, award-winning Impression, Pink Impression remains one of the most highly regarded tulips since its introduction in 1979. It is luminous soft empire-rose, maturing to deep neyron-rose with an interior, black base, narrowly edged in yellow. Pink Impression is incredible. Late April/May. HZ: 3-7. Height: 20" to 22".

Coral Prince Tulip (New)

It has huge, iridescent coral-pink flowers with deeper rose striations, peach-yellow edges and an ivory base. It is incredibly striking planted en masse, particularly alongside sibling Purple Prince. Tulip Class: Giant Darwin Hybrid. Bulb size: 12 cm/up. Late April/May. HZ: 3-7. Height: 22".



Rodeo Drive Tulip (New)

Rodeo Drive has one of the largest flowers ever on incredibly strong stems. It's just huge! Not only is it immense, but it has shapely, glowing, rich blood-red flowers with small yellow bases. Rodeo Drive shines from afar in gardens and is amazing in cut flower bouquets. Tulip Class: Triumph. Bulb size: 12 cm/up. April/May. HZ: 3-7. Height: 18".



Yellow Purissima Tulip (New)

A cherished sport of White Emperor, this sunny award-winner is yellow with a deeper canary-yellow base and edges. It is gorgeous paired with Emperor Tulips Orange and White Emperor for a bright creamsicle mixture. Tulip Class: Emperor. Bulb size: 12 cm/up. Late April. HZ: 3-8. Height: 16" to 18".




King Alfred DNII (Favorite)

The legendary Trumpet Daffodil King Alfred, so registered in Great Britain in the 1890s, set the platinum standard by which all golden-yellow Trumpet Daffodils have been judged since. We offer you Trumpet Daffodil Dutch Master, the best King Alfred look-alike based on its vivid yellow color, strong substance, classic form, health and excellent naturalizing capability. Narcissus Class: Trumpet or Long Cupped Daffodils (Royal Horticultural Society Division 1). Bulb size: DNII: 15/17 cm. April. HZ: 3-7. 18" to 20".



Goblet Narcissus (Favorite)

This award-winning 1952 bi-color has a partially overlapping, glistening white perianth and a trumpet-shaped, brilliant golden-yellow cup with ruffled edge. The cup pales to lemon-yellow as it matures. Narcissus Class: Trumpet or Long Cupped Daffodils). Bulb size: 14/16 cm. April. HZ: 3-7. Height: 16" to 18".



This charming naturalizer has a 3" ivory-white perianth and a flared, trumpet-shaped cup of ivory, to pale apricot, to deep Chinese-coral at its wavy rim. As with all Pink Narcissi, it benefits from filtered sunlight so it may develop its best *pink* coloration. Narcissus Class: Large Cupped Bulb size: 14/16 cm. April. HZ: 3-7. Height: 18" to 20".





Tahiti Narcissus (Returning Favorite)

Tahiti is a 1956 Lionel Richardson award-winning variety with large, 4"-wide, soft yellow flowers with a fully double cup offset with shorter, frilled orange petal segments. The colorful contrast between its perianth and flouncy double cup is incredibly showy. Late April. HZ: 3-8. Height: 14" to 16".

Teal Narcissus (Returning Favorite)

This 1975 Grant Mitsch lemon-yellow hybrid has a star-shaped, 4"-wide perianth and a cylindrical trumpet with a slightly flared and rolled, wavy, almost toothy, rim. The elegant trumpet gradually matures to high contrast, bright white with a white halo around its base. April. HZ: 3-7. Height: 24" to 26".



Bantam Narcissus (New)

An award-winning 1950 English heirloom, Bantam has a flawless, well-overlapping, recurved, greenish-yellow perianth and a 2" sulfur-yellow, bowl-shaped cup with an orange-edged, frilly rim. The flowers may be small, but they are absolutely gorgeous and showy. Later-flowering. Narcissus Class: Large Cupped Bulb size:12/14 cm. April. HZ: 3-7. Height: 18" to 20"

Scilla Siberica Spring Beauty (New)

Circa 1796, the *Siberian Squill* bears up to six, drooping, vivid sky-blue flowers on strong stems to emblazon woodland floors, rock gardens and garden borders. Spring Beauty naturalizes readily in areas of light shade or dappled sunlight. Full to partial sunlight. Bloom time in horticultural zone 5: April. Plant 5" deep and 4" to 6" apart. HZ: 3-8. Height: 5".


