Allersandro Laurio presented an update on his Malaria Defense Project. By the time Allersando was 12 years old he had suffered three cases of malaria. At age 12 he got the idea of the Malaria Defense Project, a project to provide mosquito nets to completely enclose the sleep area for children. His goat was to provide over 2,000 nets in 2015. He met the goal by providing about 2,500 nets. Along with providing the nets, training is provided on the proper use of the nets.

He had a series of fund raising project, his most successful was on on-line auction on Face Book.

For the Baobab Children the project provided 80 nets. For a HIV clinic they provided another 80 nets. It is very important to provide the nets to HIV positive children as their immune system is compromised. For the Wise and Solace Foundation the project provided 500 nets for children. All of the nets were provided to sub Sahara countries.

Mosquitos are the number one killer in the world. In a recent year, over 725,000 were killed by mosquito borne illnesses. The nets reduce deaths by about 40 percent, and clinic visits by about 60 percent.
