Wesley Jones, above, of the Denver Museum of Nature and Science introduced the concept of citizen scientists that are being used at the Museum. Citizen scientists are scientists that have retired from their profession and still want to keep their hand in science by doing projects at the Museum.



Possible indicator of obesity. This experiment is being conducted in conjunction with the University of Colorado Boulder. This research has resulted in 4 to 5 published papers.

The Denver Museum of Nature and Science is on the forefront of leading this type research where retired scientists can come in as a volunteer and continue to do research. The benefits of this citizen scientist program is that it creates a teaching opportunity for the scientists, it educates visitors to the museum, and it provides a research environment. For the research, the scientists have access to a much larger population of participants, the Museum visitors, that a normal university research project would have. This allows for a greater cross-section of the population to participate which improves the results for the research.



Michael McAteer, a retired scientist has been working for the past 1 ¹/₂ years on Mondays as a citizen scientist for the Museum. His project has been "Is Bacteria the Reason for Your Sweet Tooth." This project has been using visitors to the Museum in the experiment. Participants are asked to taste 5 different substances and rate them on sweetness. DNA samples are also taken from the inside of the cheek. The experiment also looks at the bacteria in a persons mouth. A certain type of bacteria has been identified as a
