They are composed of eight spaces. There is the maker space where individuals can make items. Another is a 21st Century library. Another element is the corporate space where various corporations can have their offices. A fourth element is retail space. There is the co-working space. The sixth element is a conference center. The last two elements consist of a STEM school and millennial housing.

Innovation Pavilion is working on developing this concept in Olathe, KS and Parker, CO. They have teamed with a STEM school out of Highlands Ranch.

Arrow Electronic is a major supporter of this concept. IP looks for initial developments of about 100 to 200K square feet of space with a final growth to 5 acres for a campus. They are also working with the City of Centennial.

The Foundation was formally named the Rotary Foundation in 1928. In 1938 Rotary set a goal but that goal was put in suspension do to the war. In 1947 \$1.3 Million was donated to the Foundation in memory of Paul Harris. The Paul Harris Foundation recognition started in 1957. Currently, the Foundation has over \$1 Billion in funds.

The Foundation was recently audited and was one of only three foundations to receive a perfect score from the audit.



The above chart is tracking polio cases this year versus last year. The blue bars are for 2016 and the gray bars are for 2015. Unfortunately there has been a jump of 5 cases in the last two weeks with 4 cases this past week. Cases of polio in Nigeria remain steady at 4.
