

ROTARY ARTHUR N. BREWER SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION FORM 2016

This scholarship is awarded annually to a student or students who are judged to most closely fulfill the ideals of scholarship, school, community involvement, and attitude toward life as was exemplified by the life-long educator, Rotarian, and founding President of the Rotary Club of Castle Rock, Arthur N. Brewer.

Applicants will be judged on their academic achievements, school and community service and by how the applicants apply the Rotary Four-Way Test in their everyday lives. The applicants will be further judged on their essay which represents 25% of the overall score, academic achievement is 50% of overall score, school/community service 15% of overall score, neatness and punctuation on the application is 5% overall score, and adherence to application instructions is 5% of overall score.

There are two scholarships: the largest is for students/applicants that are involved with Rotary's Interact Club; and the second scholarship program is for students, though active in their school and community, who are not members of Interact.

WHAT IS ROTARY:

Rotary is an international organization of local community service clubs. The **Object of Rotary** is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise. Rotarians around the world serve their community by using their work related talents to help others – both in the local community and internationally. Rotary Club of Castle Rock, for example, has raised and continues to raise money for the Women's Crisis Center, Senior Center, Douglas/Elbert County Task Force, impoverished communities in other parts of the world including new wells for clean drinking water among other activities, sponsor Rotary's Youth Exchange Program, Scholarships, and the Club built the Rock Park Shelter in Castle Rock. Rotarians are committed to **high ethical standards**. Their commitment is reflected in the **Rotary's Four Way Test**. Rotarians promote the Object of Rotary by applying the Four Way Test to what we think, say and do:

1. IS IT THE TRUTH
2. IS IT FAIR TO ALL CONCERNED?
3. WILL IT BUILD GOOD WILL AND BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. WILL IT BE BENEFICIAL TO ALL CONCERNED?

WHAT YOU ARE TO DO:

1. Attach at least one letter of reference. Extra credit for additional references. Three maximum.
2. Answer the questions appearing on the next page (you may use an attachment for your answers).
3. Attach a copy of your High School transcript.
4. Send your application to the mailing address, e-mail address or website listed below by no later than April 15, 2016. Do not drop your application in the Scholarship Committee's personal mail box – it must be mailed and postmarked (no later than April 15th) if it is not sent by e-mail or on-line via the website. Failure to comply will void your application.
