This week we will turn our focus to polio eradication. As most of us know, Rotary supports all manner of humanitarian causes. Causes, both local and global, all over the planet. Denver Mile High Rotary works to support economic development and women's empowerment in Zimbabwe. We provide weekend food bags for children at Harrington Elementary here in Denver. We provide access to clean water and improved sanitation to the rural poor in Nicaragua. We also provide low cost health care to the residents of Villa Park thru the 9 Health Fair. The list goes on from there – but you get the point. We do lot's of great things.

The one initiative that Rotary pursues globally, with a united and single minded focus, is polio eradication. All Rotarians, worldwide, share this task to eradicate polio from the face of the planet. So how do each of us, individually, participate in this task? It's doubtful that any of us will travel to Pakistan or Afghanistan to inoculate children there. This is just not our role. What we can do is to support these efforts financially and to help spread the word as to how the final chapter of polio eradication will play out. We must be the voice of polio eradication with our families, friends, neighbors and coworkers.

Financially, DMHR has contributed over \$4000 to polio eradication since July 1st. Our contribution per member is the second highest of all the clubs in District 5450. We should be extremely proud of what we have done and will continue to do to help in this fight. Hopefully, within a handful of years we won't have any need to continue this fight.

The last part of this story is our role as educators. Many non-Rotarians now see polio as a forgotten disease. A handful of cases in remote parts of the world is hardly newsworthy. Few recognize the ease with which polio could spread if it is not eradicated – completely and finally. Few recognize that eradication means an end to polio inoculation. This is good news that should be shared. This month marks a milestone in which there will no longer be a need to inoculate against Type 2 polio virus. Type 2 polio no longer exists in the wild. Only Type 1 and Type 3 remain.

We will dedicate this week's meeting to learning about the final campaign to end polio forever. Zone Polio Coordinator Dan Himelspach will lead us thru a series of videos outlining the final campaign. Soon we will no longer need to say "we are this close", instead we will be able to say "we have ended polio – forever!".






Rotary Club Rafting Trip


