## **Service Above Self - Volunteer Opportunities**

#### **Rotary International DEI**

A top priority for Rotary is growing and diversifying our membership to make sure we reflect the communities we serve and are inclusive of all cultures, experiences, and identities. We're creating an organization that is more open and inclusive, fair to all, builds goodwill, and benefits our communities.

To help us achieve our goal, the RI Board of Directors passed a diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) statement: "As a global network that strives to build a world where people unite and take action to create lasting change, Rotary values diversity and celebrates the contributions of people of all backgrounds, regardless of their age, ethnicity, race, color, abilities, religion, socioeconomic status, culture, sex, sexual orientation, and gender identity. Rotary will cultivate a diverse, equitable, and inclusive culture in which people from underrepresented groups have greater opportunities to participate as members and leaders."

#### What is our Club doing?

We are using a survey to get a benchmark and gain creative ideas from all of our members to apply for a DEI award worth \$1,500. Information about the award is listed below to help guide your ideas. Whether we win the award or not, we will implement our "award worthy" ideas. We estimate the survey will take you about 10 minutes to complete. There are four sections with definitions and descriptions. Click Next (white button on left side of survey) to go to the next section. There are 12 questions, the first seven are required and help us capture a baseline, which we will measure against. The last four are open text where you may want to brainstorm a bit to capture your ideas for this initiative and share anything you think will help us take action on the DEI&B initiative.

We strongly encourage you to participate in this survey; we're looking to gather as much feedback as we can about the collective experience at Denver Mile High Rotary. This survey is anonymous and there is no way to identify specific individual responses - they are only presented in aggregate.

#### Information about the award:

For: This unique and forward looking award challenges Clubs to imagine, create and implement meaningful and courageous diversity initiatives within their Clubs that will empower them to advance the cause and conversation of diversity, equity, and inclusion.

Type: \$1,500 payment to the Club judged to have the most creative and potentially impactful diversity initiative for implementation within their Club. **DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION: May 1** 

Rules: The "Rotary Has a Dream" Diversity Award recognizes a Rotary Club in District 5450 whose forward looking initiatives and efforts will result in significantly increasing the conversation and understanding of reducing intolerance of Racial, Ethnic, Religious, Gender and Sexual Diversity within their club, with an ultimate goal of creating a more diverse Club membership body.

**History:** Conceived by Diana Whye, the first African American Club President in the Rotary Club of Centennial's 20-year history, the Award is named to honor two civil rights icons, Martin Luther King, Jr. with his dream of nonviolent activism, and John Lewis, who had a vision that ordinary people could redeem the soul of America by getting into "good trouble." Both of these individuals spent their lifetimes working to reduce intolerance in society and risk their lives to effect this change.

Criteria: The proposed initiative(s) should be able to be implemented within a 12-month period from the date of the award; examples of the types of initiatives that would qualify for the award include diversity speaker fees, diversity training opportunities, etc. Be creative and have fun! You're limited only by the imagination of your Club! All evaluations will be judged relative to the potential to expand the conversation, education and understanding of diversity, equity, and inclusion within the award applicant's Club.

#### **Project Worthmore - Volunteer anytime**

Project Worthmore is a local non-profit that serves the refugee community in the Denver metro area by providing a dental clinic, language classes, food for their community, as well as other services. We may **volunteer any Monday** during the entire month to help with food packaging and/or contactless deliveries. **Please contact Tom Cella** for more information and to volunteer.

Where: Project Worthmore is located at 1666 Elmira Street, Aurora

What: They need a total of 8 volunteers - 3 to help with packaging and 5 to help with contactless deliveries.

When: The first Monday of every month.

**10:30am - 12:30pm**: **Food Packaging**. Three volunteers will work in a well-ventilated room to put together boxes of food for the refugee families.

12:30pm - 1:30pm: Deliver boxes of food to families within about a 3-mile radius of Project Worthmore.

## **Paying Club Dues with Zelle**

#### Using Zelle® to pay by check without mailing!

Several members have expressed interest in paying dues with **Zelle**®, a service that allows Club members to send dues payments electronically to DMH Rotary. There is no charge and the transaction occurs in only a few minutes. And, the sender can choose the amount to send. Below is information about signing up for **Zelle**® and setting up the payment information for Denver Mile High Rotary.

#### **Enroll with Zelle®**

(your bank must offer **Zelle**® as a service)

- 1. Sign into Online Banking or mobile banking on your electronic device
- 2. Go to "Send Money with Zelle®" in Online Banking or the Zelle® tab in the Mobile app.
- 3. Agree to terms and conditions.
- 4. Enroll your account.
- 5. Verify security code.
- 6. You're ready to start sending/receiving payments through your bank account using Zelle®.

#### How to send money to Denver Mile High Rotary

- 1. Enter rotarydmh@gmail.com as the unique identifier for the Rotary Club of Denver Mile High. You can use DMHR as the name of the Club.
- 2. Enter the amount of the payment and an optional memo. (e.g., invoice number)
- 3. Review your payment. Make sure that you've entered the correct email address for the Club; then hit "Send."
- 4. Your payment will appear with your name on the Club's bank statement.
