Project Worthmore is a local non-profit that serves the refugee community in the Denver metro area by providing a dental clinic, language classes, food for their community, as well as other services. We may volunteer any Monday during the entire month to help with food packaging and/or contactless deliveries. Please contact Tom Cella for more information and to volunteer.

Where: Project Worthmore is located at 1666 Elmira Street, Aurora

What: They need a total of 8 volunteers - 3 to help with packaging and 5 to help with contactless deliveries. When: The first Monday of every month.

Greetings,



Thank you on behalf of our disabled veterans who, with your support, were able to go whitewater rafting this year with us, and thanks from our staff: Karen House, Dr. Lew Kleinhans, and me. This was our tenth year, 35 trips to date, about 550 veterans and caregivers served.

Our whitewater trips go through Canyonlands National Park on the Colorado River. The Park was closed because of Covid until late spring. We had to cancel the three launches scheduled in May, and made effort to move them into September. Two of the three commercial outfitters accommodated us, so we launched the Special Operations trip (WorldWide Expeditions), the Open Manifest trip (Navtec), and the All Female trip (Sheri Griffith River Expeditions, already scheduled in September) in September. The outfitters graciously charge us at about 20-25% of the going rate. The motels charge us about 1/3 the going rate. We are all volunteer; all support goes directly to our program.

Ravens Rim Ziplines zipped the women. Their course up on the slick rock consists of 6 links, two of which are over 1200 feet long.

As you no doubt know, these river trips can be very healing. The VA has told me that they have graduated a number of their vets off High Risk Suicide Watch after the trip that these soldiers, among themselves, are better healers than what the VA can accomplish with therapy and pharmaceuticals. Some of the participants have told us that they have weaned themselves of substance abuse, are back in their marriage, are employed. Know that over 8000 veterans commit suicide each year, more than we have lost in 19 years of combat in the Middle East.

I'm including a photo album from last year's trips. These are given out to the vets so they can hearken back to their trip and recall the good time with their buddies (without alcohol), and remember to stay in touch. Notice that, in spite of their disability, they are all smiling. And the albums go out to my contributors so show where their money and support went.

Paying Club Dues with Zelle

Using Zelle[®] to pay by check without mailing!

Several members have expressed interest in paying dues with **Zelle**[®], a service that allows Club members to send dues payments electronically to DMH Rotary. There is no charge and the transaction occurs in only a few minutes. And, the sender can choose the amount to send. Below is information about signing up for **Zelle**[®] and setting up the payment information for Denver Mile High Rotary.

Enroll with Zelle®

(your bank must offer **Zelle®** as a service)

- 1. Sign into Online Banking or mobile banking on your electronic device
- 2. Go to "Send Money with Zelle[®]" in Online Banking or the **Zelle[®]** tab in the Mobile app.
- 3. Agree to terms and conditions.
- 4. Enroll your account.
- 5. Verify security code.
- 6. You're ready to start sending/receiving payments through your bank account using Zelle®.

How to send money to Denver Mile High Rotary

- 1. Enter rotarydmh@gmail.com as the unique identifier for the Rotary Club of Denver Mile High. You can use DMHR as the name of the Club.
- 2. Enter the amount of the payment and an optional memo. (e.g., invoice number)
- 3. Review your payment. Make sure that you've entered the correct email address for the Club; then hit "Send."
- 4. Your payment will appear with your name on the Club's bank statement.
