#### Important Info Re: Our In-person Meetings at the University Club...

Starting on July 1, as we slowly and cautiously plan to return to in person meetings there will be changes we have to embrace. The majority of responses from our surveys indicated the desire to meet in person again. We will also be ZOOMING the meetings for our members that cannot and should not join us in person, and by all means, do not feel pressured to join us in person if you do not feel comfortable in doing so, or if you not feeling well or are running a fever.

Brad or volunteer will be sending out a weekly survey, asking if you will be attending our meeting in person and if you want breakfast. It is imperative to respond, especially regarding the food, as there will NOT be the normal buffet, there will be a single server, plating the items you would like to eat; therefore we need to have accurate numbers of eaters, so they know how much food to make for our hungry Rotarians. Your responses will need to be submitted by Sunday evening, so Brad can send the final numbers to the U Club, so they can have the right amount of food on hand for us.

Everyone will need to wear a mask. You can only remove your mask once seated at your table, to eat and drink. We must practice social distancing, no handshakes, no hugs. Be aware of the entry/exit points, stairways, and give people 6' distance please.

The U-Club has moved furniture, and groups of 3 can sit in the upstairs/fireplace room to chat. There are 4-5 areas there where you can have a small group together.

When entering the College Room, where we gather, you MUST go directly to a table and be seated. There will be the 8' Round tables set up, with only 4 chairs at each table. Please no mingling or standing. Go directly to a table and be seated.

Please keep your masks on until you are seated. You should only remove your mask if you are eating or drinking. If you are NOT eating or drinking, please keep you masks on.

There will be no community coffee/tea/juice service. A single server will take your order once you are seated at your table.

The U club will be monitoring their employees daily and will be abiding by all CDC guidelines for meetings, food prep, service and everything else.

## District Grants Training Webinar

Effective July 1, 2020, *the District will implement grant changes* based on demand and using DDF as efficiently as possible, and on changes made by The Rotary Foundation. There will be a Grants Training webinar Thursday, June 18, from 1:00-4:00 pm that will cover the changes and meet the training requirement needed for clubs to apply for grants. <u>Click Here to register now</u>. The important grant changes effective on July 1, 2020, are:

**District Grants:** 

- DDF allotment for District Grants of \$145,000
- Elimination of grants specifically for Satellite Clubs.
- Global Grants:
- DDF allotment for Global Grants of \$130,000
- First Come First Serve process for DDF allocation
- Continued dollar for dollar DDF match by TRF
- Elimination of the 50% match on cash contributions.

Any Global Grant application currently in process will be subject to the rules in place during 2019-2020, **provided that the grant application is submitted to RI no later than June 30, 2020**. If the Grant is not submitted by that date, the application will be subject to the rules effective July 1, 2020. <u>Click Here</u> to read more detail about the 2020-21 Grant Terms and Conditions.
