3.) Thank the freedom fighter/American hero for protecting our country and our freedoms. If time permits, The Troops enjoy responding with their own messages—please provide a mailing or email address with every letter/card/picture delivered to For The Troops.

4.) Send letters to: For The Troops P.O. Box 12 Simi Valley, CA 93062.
