Ted Hendryx shared the following story about his mother's keen eye for art. He inherited several paintings that she purchased from the Egyptian artist Tahia Halin in the 1970's while she and her husband were living in Cairo. (Ted spent his junior year at the American University in Cairo.) His mother's prescient patronage of Halin's work was a gift to Ted: A few months ago, he commissioned Christie's Auction House in London to sell one of the paintings. Ted attended the reception Christie's held in London the night before the auction.



His painting was displayed with other works for sale in one of several elegant galleries. As he was standing by his Halin,

a Christie's broker took him aside and invited him to see something special. She led him behind a door and into a closed gallery in the adjoining salon. Hanging on the wall was the newly discovered "Salvator Mundi" painting by Leonardo da Vinci. It would be shipped the next day for auction at Christie's NYC offices.

Attached is a picture of Ted standing by the painting prior to its record-breaking sale a few days later. *Salvator Mundi* is now on display at the Lourve Abu Dhabi after being purchased by Saudi Arabian prince Bader bin Abudulla bin Mohammed bin Farhan al-Saud for \$450 million. Ted's beautiful Tahia Halin painting, titled "Mandolin," sold to a private buyer. He demures that the price was considerably less.
