Responding to Denver's Hunger Crisis

Metro Caring and the Denver Chery Creek Rotary Club joined forces to feed the hungry in Denver

The pandemic-inspired demand for food challenges Denver area food pantries

In May of this year Metro Caring, one of Denver's larger food pantries, was hit with a surge in the pandemic-inspired demand from families in need. Buying staples such as rice, bean, oats and flour in bulk quantities was cost-effective and economical, but processing and distributing such bulk quantities to individual families proved challenging, and Metro Caring lacked the facilities needed to receive, store and break down the bulk goods.

The Denver Cherry Creek Rotary Club responded to this dilemma in two ways. A club member arranged for the use of a vacant warehouse, which was cleaned, outfitted and organized for food repackaging, and the club pledged to both supervise the warehouse and to find and schedule volunteers for up to eight shifts per week. The Warehouse Project has been operational since early June.

During shifts on weekdays and weekends, mornings, afternoons and evenings, up to 16 volunteers and a supervisor, all donating their time, masked and gloved, gather in a "socially distant" manner in the 20,000 square foot ventilated warehouse to repackage 50-pound bags of dry goods into 1-2 pound bags suitable for distribution. The three-hour shifts are punctuated by laughter, conversation and music. A typical shift processes over 2000 lbs. of packaged food. Metro Caring sends trucks to pick up to packaged goods which are then distributed through their pantry to over 3000 families each week. The operation is efficient, safe and fun, but finding 70 to 80 volunteers each week, however, is a constant struggle.
