CITRUS DELVERY

There are two primary events for citrus this week. The first is delivery of the fruit, which is targeted to arrive Wednesday. We will need some people to be able to help unload the ~136 boxes to put them into the shipping containers until we distribute them Saturday morning. We need at least three people to also meet the truck to unload efficiently.

- We will need the buyers (or the club members who facilitated the purchases) to pick up the fruit baskets between 10am and noon on Saturday morning at the FFT location.
- All the fruit, except for the FFT boxes will be placed in cellophane bags with bow ties and placed in baskets. We will start packing the baskets at 9am, so they should be ready by 10 for distribution.
- We need Rotarians to help unload the boxes at FFT, pack them in the bags, put on the twist ties and put them in the boxes. It will be assembly line fashion and we need probably 5 people there to help. Karly is not available to be there. Bit I will be there.
- All the baskets and cellophane, will be there and all the fruit will be packed. All the Rotarians need to do is show to pick up the fruit.

We distribute the fruit on Saturday Morning.

Denver Mile High Rotary Upcoming Programs

December 11th - Ian Miller Denver Museum of Nature and Science Denver scientists make "unprecedented" fossil finds at Corral Bluffs open space.

"After the big Astroid banged into the Yucatán Peninsula, many animal species died off including the dinosaurs but a few other animal species hung on in very diminished numbers. This was a time when other animals could recover and expand and evolve without big creatures eating them. DMNS, because of two of their scientists, Ian Miller and Tyler Lipson, has found a geologic site near Colorado Springs with a geologic record of the evolution of animal species that had been minimized by the predator dinosaurs but began to survive, expand and diversify without them.

Based on their recent excavations, they will tell the story of how other animals, especially mammals, began to multiply and diversify in absence of dinosaurs."
