**August 24<sup>th</sup> -** Dr. Katherine Kelaidis is a scholar and writer. She will be speaking to us this week on *Immigration Across Our Mexican Border*.

Katie holds a Ph.D. in Classics from the University of London and a Bachelor of Arts in Classical Languages from the University of California, Berkeley. Previously she has been a Visiting Associate at Oxford and a Research Associate at the Freie Universitat Berlin. Dr. Kelaidis's research interests are varied and wide ranging and include refugee and migrant policy. A passionate advocate for community education, she gives frequent public lectures on a host of historical and literary topics and is involved in a variety of public engagement projects.

**August 31<sup>st</sup> -** Chris Figureida will speak about his project, Cycle for Heart. Chris is attempting his 10<sup>th</sup> cross country bike ride to raise awareness about healthy and active lifestyles and explaining why physical activity is important. Chris is active with the American Heart Association and Rotary International's Polio Plus Program.

**September 7<sup>th</sup> -** Jon Kedrowski is an author, ski-mountaineer, and geographer. John summited all 55 of Colorado's 14ers and will discuss his adventures and his book, Sleeping on the Summits, Colorado Fourteener High Bivys. An accomplished mountaineer, Jon successfully climbed Mount Everest in 2012, and was featured in the Dateline NBC documentary, Into the Death Zone.


