Africa is Calling All Adventurers

Many of you met Stella Dongo from the Highlands Club in Harare, Zimbabwe last week at the Club meeting. Stella has been our partner for 12 years in our Rotary grants in Harare Zimbabwe.

These grants have funded training for over 6,000 women in economic and computer skills. These women have used the Rotary training as a way to change their lives. What they learned changed their attitudes about who they are and what they can do. It changed their lives.

And now you have a chance to meet them and see what they have learned...A chance to hear their stories—from despair to hope—and experience the joy that Rotary projects can bring. We will visit these women before the during their trainings and capture their stories to share with the world.

We will start to arrive on Monday August 28 in Harare Zimbabwe. We will be staying at the Bronte Hotel, a colonial oasis in the center of town. The hotel has excellent internet service and two restaurants.

Our Activities during the week

Monday August 28:

Arrive on Monday afternoon or evening

Tuesday August 29:

Visit the original training sites and interview women who graduated from the trainings

Wednesday August 30:

Visit the current trainings in the morning and interview participants

Attend Highlands Rotary meeting

Thursday August 31:

Visit the current trainings and interview participants. Have lunch in the community Friday September 1: Attend Grant Closing Celebration Celebration dinner Saturday September 2: Depart.



During our time in Harare, we can also explore the city, visit other Rotary Clubs and arrange a visit to a close-by game park.

September 3rd – Arrival in Livingston, Zambia. Hotel information available for the group. Hotel is located near Victoria Falls (just the other side of the Zambezi River from Vic Falls, Zimbabwe.

September 4th – Site visit to Grace Centre and Dani's Home with Rotarians.

September 5th – Day safari to Chobe (Botswana). This is a land and water safari combined and very well done.

September 6th – Choice of activities – there is a large menu of interesting things to do. Lion safari, when you walk with the lions and have your picture taken with them. Or the Elephant back safari where you ride on the back of an elephant for your safari – both of those are half day. I would suggest that evening for us to go on the African Queen sunset cruise if it is available. It is a good way to cap off the stay.

September 7th – Depart for Cape Town, South Africa September 8-10 – Activities to be determined. Some ideas might be; Tour to Table Mountain, coastal tours, tour of Robinson Island where Mandela was held prisoner for 26 years, winery tours – lovely wine country near Cape Town. September 11th – Depart for home


