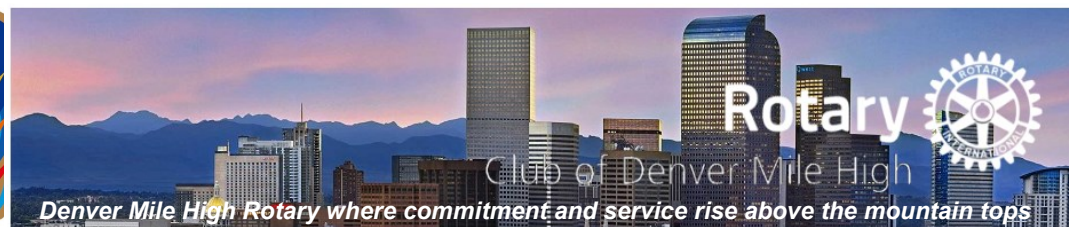

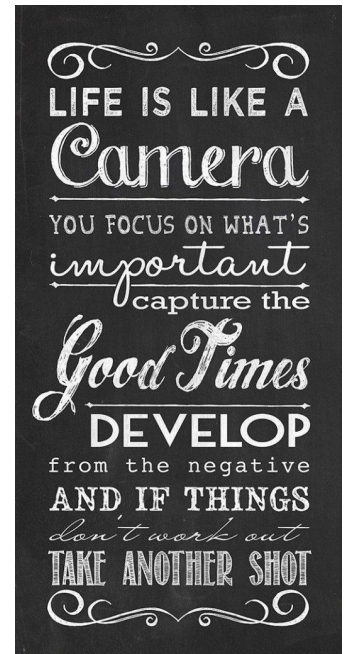

The American Museum of Western Art provides access to one of the world's most comprehensive collections of Western art in one of the most unique settings in the country, the historic Navarre Building. The Collection is displayed in a salon style, which is in keeping with the Navarre's 19th Century origins and allows the Museum to exhibit a survey of Western art and history. The Museum's permanent exhibition (which includes over 300 paintings, drawings, and sculptures by more than 180 artists and spans nearly 200 years of American history) promotes the public's understanding and appreciation of art depicting the American West from the early 1800s through the present day.

Zimbabwe Women's Empowerment Rotary Global Grant Approved



Denver Mile High has been a partner with the Highlands Rotary Club in Zimbabwe since 2005. During this time, we have jointly sponsored several grants that provided economic and computer trainings, primarily to women, in high-density communities in Harare Zimbabwe. We have engaged at least 25 Rotary Clubs in the USA and Zimbabwe to participate in the grant.

RI President Ravi Ravindran visited the project in early March 2016 and called this project a model for community development that should be replicated through the world.

In late 2015, Harare and Colorado Rotarians met with the participants, trainers and very supportive local government officials to explore how best to assist other women in greater Harare. We considered how best to serve the communities and take advantage of what we had learned from previous trainings.

Together we decided to replicate the project in communities where we have not previously been involved. This would enable us to share the program with women who wanted to acquire the skills, both economic and computer, to support themselves. These new trainings will be even more focused on preparing the women for economic independence, with two training tracks and more hands-on activities to reinforce concepts in the training.

Host Rotarians worked with the training organization to select the training sites, and they have been actively engaged in the development of the grant. They will participate in the selection of the participants and provide special topics training sessions. They will manage the grant funds and stay in touch with Denver Mile High throughout the duration of the grant.

Nineteen Rotary Clubs and two Rotary Districts contributed to the Global Grant that will provide \$84,500 for this new endeavor.

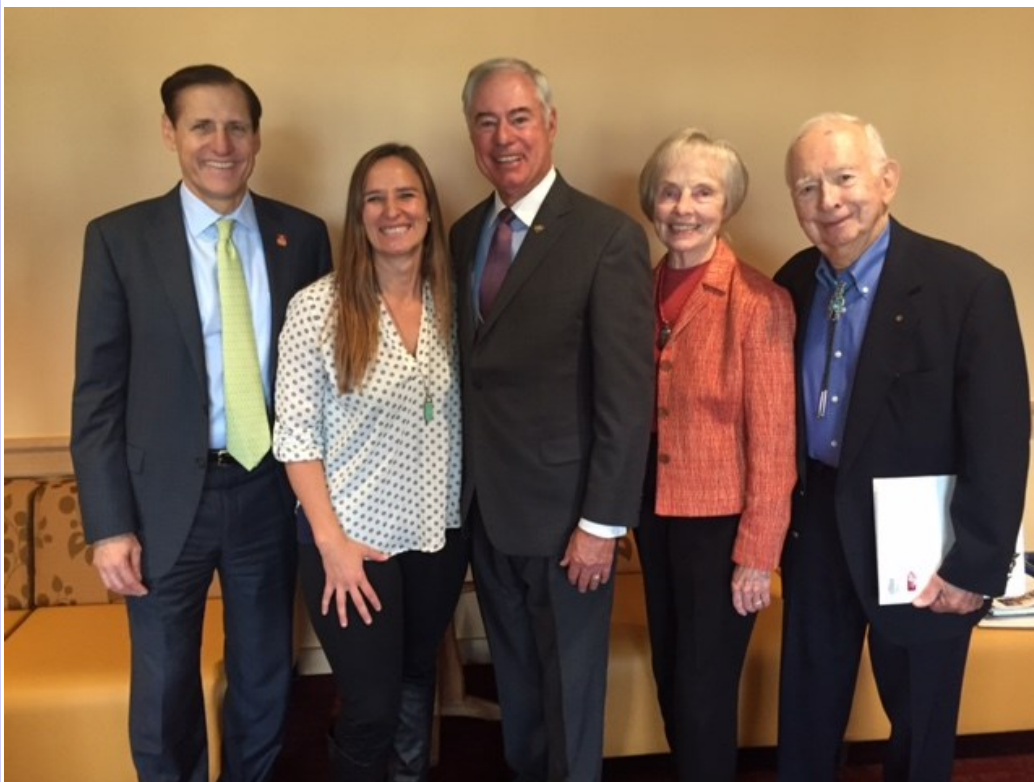
I am delighted to announce that this grant was approved on Monday.

Plans are underway to schedule the launch and start the training, which will last about one year. The big celebration, and one that we hope many of you will attend, will probably be scheduled next September. It will be a great opportunity to see the power of Rotary in action and meet the women who have changed their lives through this program.

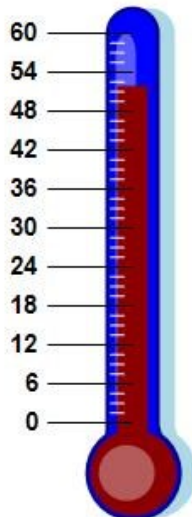
Rotary is Everywhere!

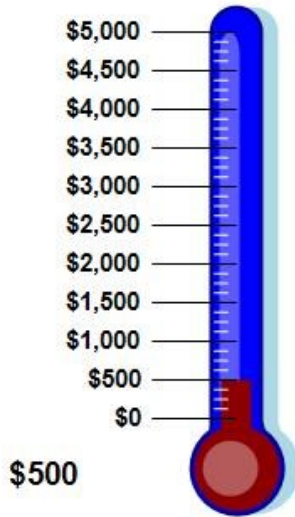

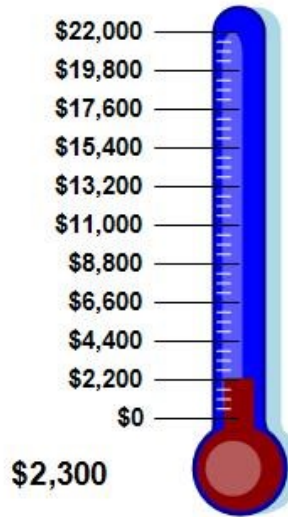
