

The following has been extracted and edited from this November's Rotary Magazine and is contained in President John Germ's letter this month:

In the momentous 1917 Rotary Convention in Atlanta then-President Arch C. Klumph addressed the issue of establishing philanthropy within Rotary and especially the establishment of The Rotary Foundation. He spoke "It seems eminently proper that we should accept endowments for the purpose of doing good in the world". That was nearly 100 years ago but set in place the mechanism that allowed Rotary (and our club) to become the vast force for doing good in the world.

Today, Denver Mile High Rotary members participate generously to The Rotary Foundation, Polio Plus and to our Denver Mile High Rotary Foundation for supporting the efforts that Rotary International and our club do locally, internationally and particularly in our fight to completely conquer Polio. These foundations work together to do good in the world. For example, our contributions to our Denver Mile High Foundation support our local and world community service projects. And we tap into our donations to the International Rotary Foundation through District grants and Global grants that increase the impact of our local and world community service projects
