We visited the Safe Outdoor Space **SOS** site on 13th and Quivas. Among the takeaways: <u>Please click here</u> to view the Wednesday SOS power point.

1} A powerful **personal story** by Cuica, overall SOS sites manager, highlighting how an "average" person might experience abnormal and traumatic events that culminate in the loss of job and property resulting in mental health/substance issues and home-lessness. With the aid of the "safety net" system including housing and support ser-

vices, people can recover and resume higher levels of functioning.

2} Addressing one of the biggest neighborhood concerns regarding SOS camps coming into an area, crime rates have gone down, not up; 25% of residents move into permanent housing; a number of empowering community services are brought to the camp and are actively accessed.

3) **Opportunities** for club volunteer activities might include: monthly social visits with food as part of the event, starting a book club, conducting classes based on camp interests, clothing drives, and helping with some of the camp set up and maintenance activities (one such activity in the calendar). <u>SOS Power Point Presentation</u>.



Dear Family and Friends,

On Wednesday, September 20, 2023, the Denver Mile High Rotary Club and I will be taking a **Peace Walk in Denver's City Park**. The walk will begin at 7:00 AM starting at the Bandshell on Ferril Lake, the middle of the park. I invite you to join. During the park tour, we will cover 3 miles, with an option to stop after a quarter mile, depending on your availability.

The walk is **free** and is designed to be fun and educational. Based on a theme of "5 Easy Pieces" you will experience:

- 1. Peace Activists learn about five legends of non-violent change at the MLK monument
- 2. **Peace among People –** East High's Wall of Peace, the art of respecting cultural differences, a student created two block long street mural
- 3. Peace of Mind enjoy the urban oases and learn a bit about its nature within
- 4. Pieces of History find out how City Park came to be
- 5. **Pieces of Rotary** learn some of the diverse ways our club contributes to community well-being with local and global projects

Our portfolio of ongoing club projects from this past year includes: working in local food banks, planting trees in Denver parks and neighborhoods, supporting Afghan refugees resettling in the U.S., providing humanitarian war relief to Ukrainians, supporting health care delivery in other countries, providing vocational training in Zimbabwe, helping establish a food storage system in Nepal, attending to the mental health needs of local youth as well as people in Uganda, providing health screens for local citizens, and supporting recovering veterans. This year, we will continue to work in many of the same areas and expand efforts to address homelessness in our community.
