Warriors on Cataract Finish Veterans' Rafting Season Safely, despite highest water in years!

Greetings from Warriors on Cataract,

We just finished our third All Female raft trip, this on the Green River through the Gates of Lodore. In the words of Lead therapist Karen House who leads the trip, "The trip was FANTASTIC!!!"

These trips are conducted with females only, even the outfitter guides. It makes a big difference. Many have been assaulted in their military service and would be uneasy camping with male soldiers.

Karen reports further, "OARS (the rafting outfitter), has a standard of excellence that is clear to every guide. The trip was more deeply therapeutic for the participants, I had them do journaling every day, digging into their MST and pushing them. It was also very fun, we had several special fun nights - Hawaiian Shirt night, Onesie (pajama) night and costume night. Lots of fun."

It was a good river flow, higher than historical. They had 3 oar boats, 1 paddle boat and 3 duckies (kayaks). And a standup paddle board for the flat water.

This wraps our rafting season, five trips this year. We are now working on the photo albums and discussing the launches calendar and rivers for next year. We will no doubt run Cataract, Desolation Canyon, and Gates of Lodore. This was an epic water year in Cataract, and we are hoping for a big river next year.

We are again sponsoring our gang on the Bataan Memorial Death March that launches March 16. It is conducted on White Sands Missile Range, 26 miles of desert. This annual March is in honor of the service members who were forcemarched on Bataan, many perished along the way. Last March the Warriors on Cataract team of six of our women participated in the 81st annual march with 5000 entrants from 50 states and 5 foreign countries. They finished First in the Team Female Civilian category!
