Area 1 Rotary Club Service Opportunities.

These projects benefit Denver metro area residents and serve as great team building events for Area 1 wide Rotary clubs.

- Building Denver's Tree Canopy Jan 27th Saturday 9 AM 12 PM. Project with The Park People's west Denver tree distribution program - Denver Mile High and other Rotary clubs distribute flyers to neighborhood residences explaining access to low cost / no cost trees. Requires walking and dropping off information flyers in Villa Park (Sheridan to Federal, Colfax to 6th Ave). <u>Click here to sign-up</u>
- Addressing Homelessness Jan 31st Wednesday AM and PM shifts. (adjacent dates available) Safe Outdoor Spaces (SOS) - <u>Click here to sign up to help</u>. Help assemble pre-fab tiny home shelters in an existing SOS camp site. Involves physical activity - carrying unit items, helping with assembly, for eg placing bolts in pre-drilled holes and adding washer and nuts.
- Building Denver's Tree Canopy May 11th Saturday 9 AM Denver Mile High Rotary tree planting day. As part of the Epic Day of Service, DMHR partners with The Park People and Denver Parks & Recreation to plant 30 trees in a TBD Denver area park. Involves working with small team planting trees in pre-drilled holes prepared by Denver Forestry. A companion grant is in the works for clubs interested in partnering with the financial support of this event.
