Join us to visit Nicaragua Rotary Projects in April

We owe a special thank you to Tom Giordano for championing a DMHR Water and Sanitation Global Grant in two villages in beautiful rural Nicaragua. He has completed and received approval on his Grant and his team has raised the capital to get a \$74,000 grant going. Construction will begin in March/April 2015.

On April 12 through 19, a group of District 5450/5470 Rotarians (at present Chuck Rudolph, Bob Kemp and friend) will travel to Nicaragua to visit Nicaraguan Rotary Clubs, tour colonial towns, volcanoes and national forests, visit and work on our rural project sites.

We'll also see other completed Rotary Grant projects and observe their sustainability. We'll explore a few other out of the way communities for future Rotary project sites. Your stay will be five nights in Managua and two nights in rural towns.

Please consider joining us. Accommodations will be comfortable and modern. Your estimated cost will be around \$1000 if you use miles. There will be opportunities to extend your stay to see more of this scenic country.
